

From the Vicar

Dear Friends.

This is the first time I have had the opportunity to write via the Magazine about all the developments that we hope will be part of the coming year. 2023 ended with the joyful celebration of Emmanuel - God with us. Numbers



of those attending services were up 10% on the previous year, setting us up to look forward to 2024 with hope and confidence.

As I write this letter, engineers are installing the new Broadcast equipment so that we can continue to stream services to those unable to get to church for whatever reason. New cameras, microphones and controls will give the system we've relied on since the start of the pandemic in 2020 a much needed upgrade.

In addition to this, work on the design for disabled access to the porch is at an advanced stage and all the various permissions required before alterations to a listed building are being sought. It is a costly project, and we are looking to outside sources of funding as well as our reserves in order to pay for it. However, the improvement to the look of the front of the building will be considerable and send out a message of


welcome and inclusivity.

Other work we hope to progress this year will be on the seating, the storage and the servery. We hope to introduce flexible seating that will greatly enhance what we can do with the space, and when chairs and tables are not in use there will be a new storage space designed to keep the building looking tidy and well presented. The servery we expect to be located at the South end of the building where the play area and refreshments are currently situated. There are complicated plumbing needs with this aspect of the project but we anticipate a final design soon.

In the meantime, we have the start of Lent soon upon us with Ash Wednesday on Wednesday 14th. Please do hold all that we are doing in your prayers as we seek to bring more and more people to know the love of God revealed to us in Jesus Christ.

January meeting of the Church Council

Charitable support

William began with a follow up from the November meeting in which it had been proposed to canvas the congregation concerning which 12 charities we would support in 2024. The charities are Local, National and International. The following charities received the biggest support: Local charities - Myton Hospice, Lillington Youth Centre, Castle Froma Neurological Unit and the Lillington Pantry. National Charities - Church Homeless Charity, The Children's Society, MacMillan and Guide Dogs for the Blind. International Charities - African Vision Malawi, Water Aid, Cord and Disaster's Emergency Committee.

Control desk at the back of church

Over Christmas, Dave Snatt and Steve Hucklesby constructed a control desk at the back of church from which sound, screen and broadcasting will be controlled. A lot of work had been involved and Dave updated the PCC on progress, together with ideas for recycling pews in the future. The PCC expressed its thanks to Dave and Steve for all their hard work.

Finance

lan Jamie our treasurer updated the council on the state of the church's finances. We made good strides in closing the budget deficit in 2023 but still face a predicted budget deficit in the coming year of £3,000. It will be important that we continue to work on reducing this gap. Ian is working on the possibility of accessing historic funds from which we currently receive small amounts of interest to allow us to use the capital from these funds to help finance work on the interior of the church.

34 Lime Avenue

The house owned by the church on Lime Avenue was put up for sale in November. The market is slow but there may be

signs that this will improve in the coming year.

Entrance step into church

William updated the meeting on progress with design for the step / ramp into church. A design has been agreed on and is being considered by the Diocese and other interested parties. Materials are expensive and we are working on generating funds for what is a costly but necessary addition to the church.

Scope of the re-ordering project

As plans develop and costings begin to be made, we are turning our attention to external sources of funding. We have received advice that if we widen the scope of our project to include improvements to the kitchen and toilets in the Octagon, we might find that access to a wider range of funding sources becomes available to us. The PCC agreed therefore to explore this as an option, subject to finding someone with the time and expertise to help manage this extra project.

Audio visual installation

The week that the PCC met was the week engineers were in the church upgrading the cameras and equipment for the next chapter in our broadcast ministry. As with most complicated installations it was not without its complications, but the PCC were assured of its eventual completion and of the considerable value to those unable to attend church in person for whatever reason.

Reports

Other reports were presented to the January meeting of the Church Council. These included Fabric, Heath and Safety, Safeguarding, Love Lillington and a report from the Vicar reviewing Christmas.

Support for Ukraine

What's been happening over the last few months

It was a delight to be able to attend the Polish Centre Conference in October 2023. We had a talk about "Dogs of the Polish Army" in the Second World War. The dogs were Ciapek and Smokey. Ciapek was a co-pilot dog who enjoyed flying, and Smokey, who was a Border Collie, used to like going on parachute jumps with the squadron and had his own oxygen mask. The author Wojciech Filaber told us the stories about these two dogs. In fact his books are on sale at the Ukraine Charity Shop in the Royal Priors, and are written

for children, covering two age groups. It was also mentioned that the two dogs, stationed in separate squadrons, were a great support emotionally for the soldiers in their regiments, which in times of war is so much needed.

We also had an update from Dawid Kozlowski from the Polish Centre about the Ukraine. Dawid




has organised a total of 19 ambulances to be driven out there directly to Ukraine. The latest two were taken on 12th November 2023 - one of which you can see in the photo opposite.

In December, their Secret Santa Christmas appeal gifts for Ukrainian children were delivered - and despite a few problems were delivered in time for Christmas.

A big thank you to those who donated to the Secret Santa Appeal, with a fantastic 1,000 gifts sent out, and those who also continually donate Medical Supplies for Ukraine for the box in Church. These are still so very much needed and they do make a difference.


